

ANNUAL REPORT Avakaasha Foundation

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Year 2019-2020

We Are :

Avakaasha Foundation was officially registered on 1st Jan 2015, however we started working with schools sometime back in August 2014. What started as an experiment in one school with one teacher saw addition of five more schools and teachers to the program by 2019. On an average we directly reach out and impact 1000 students, around 1000 homes in about 10 villages every year.

Avakaasha Foundation is an NGO working towards improving quality of education in rural areas of Karnataka. We identify and partner with *rural and remote* Government schools providing free education and in need of teachers or/ and infrastructure. Our goal is to work with such schools enhancing the overall knowledge of children through experiential learning and to develop their communication skills. We support sports and cultural activities in schools associated with us and believe in the all-round growth of children. We hire only qualified women teachers either from the same or neighbouring villages, thereby providing them with the right job opportunities. We also fund basic infrastructure needs of the schools in rural areas, such as classrooms, libraries, toilets, sports equipment, laboratories, science projects etc.

Our Mission

Our mission is to improve the quality of free education in rural areas, to empower our students from low income homes to excel in their education.

Our Goals :

• Opportunity for all:

We try to reach children in remote places and provide them a quality education. Currently Avakaasha has tied up with six schools in Udupi and Kundapur taluks of Udupi District in Karnataka state. We are associated with Government schools at Hebri, Heskuttur, Molahalli, Bidkalkatte, Vaddarse and Amasebailu. These schools are located in remote areas, with not enough teaching staff. This discourages parents from sending their kids to school. With a reduced number of teachers, enrollment reduces too. This becomes a vicious cycle. By providing skilled teachers to the subjects considered to be difficult by our students, we not only help increase the admission to the schools, but also help the rest of the staff focus on what they are trained to teach. This improves the results drastically thereby attracting more and more students to the school.

• Employ & empower qualified rural women:

Avakaasha hires qualified women teachers who are recruited locally to these government schools. Thus Avakaasha provides employment and right opportunity to talented rural women.

• Focus on experiential learning:

Avakaasha encourages experiential learning in children. Children coming out of our education system are having difficulty in application of the knowledge. Therefore our focus is more on hands-on learning. We also focus on improving the communication skills of students in Kannada and English. Sports also plays a major role in our involvement in these schools. We get involved in sponsoring awards, events, students who qualify for district, state level events etc.

• Basic Infrastructure :

Foundation in addition to ensuring the schools have sufficient teaching staff, also focuses on providing funds to build basic infrastructure projects needed in schools, such as library, classrooms, projectors, toilets etc.



Our Schools:

We currently work with schools of Udupi, Karkala and Kundapur taluks in Udupi district, Karnataka State.





Government Model Government Model Higher Primary School Hebri is an old school in Karkala Taluk of Udupi district, started in 1882. It has got a current strength of 313 students. The school has bagged couple of awards like the 'Best School award' in district, state levels. **The Amasebailu school in Kundapura Taluk** was started in 1954. The school forms part of a cluster resource centrethe concept of cluster was first introduced in early nineties by the Department of Education in Karnataka to facilitate education and lend academic support. The strength of the school is around 206 this year.



The **Government Higher Primary School of Heskuttur** was started in 1957 and the current strength of the school is 227. School has featured in BBC News for its Smart Class activities and has also bagged the E- Champion Award in State level. The Government High School of Vaddarse started in the year 1998.

Today the school has a total strength of 85 including high school- 8th,9th and 10th grades.

The **Government Higher Primary School of Molahalli** was started in 1933 and the current strength of the school is 135. What started out as a primary school transformed in to Higher Primary school and later the pre-primary section.

Bidkalkatte Government Higher Primary School in Udupi district also became a part of the Foundation. It is one among the 1000 schools selected to become a Karnataka Public School, current strength is around 414.





Overview of the year 2019-2020

Avakaasha Foundation was officially started in 2015. We started out with Thekkatte school and government school in Hebri and then added more schools and teachers in the following years. The following year we expanded and reached out to more schools.

Avakaasha partnered with following three schools- Government Model Higher Primary School Hebri, Government Higher Primary School Heskuttur, K.S.M.School Thekkatte (till Dec 2016). We collaborated & funded Government school of Heskuttur for Children's day celebration and Government school of Hebri for annual day celebration.

In the year 2018 the Government School of Amasebailu got associated with Avakaasha and a new teacher was provided for English to the school by the Foundation. Similarly Government Higher Primary school of Hunsemakki in Kundapur also got associated with us. We have provided an English/science teacher for the school. Amasebailu did not have a restroom facility for girls. Avakaasha Foundation helped/sponsored the construction of toilets. We also sourced and sponsored for Headmasters training.

The following year saw Karnataka Public School, Bidkalkatte getting associated with us.

2019-2020 Activities

1. Added two new schools:

The Government School of Molahalli got associated with Avakaasha and a teacher was provided for English to the school by the Foundation. Similarly, Government High school of Vaddarse also got associated with us. We have provided an English/science teacher for the school.

The Foundation withdrew its support for Hunsemakki, due to lack of involvement from school management & decrease in school intake of children.

2. Spoken English Club Inauguration



Avakaasha Foundation participated and sponsored Spoken English Club activities at Vaddarse School.

Our founder Shreepad Kuthyar addressed the students encouraging them to learn English as an additional language, without forgetting their mother tongue and Kannada.

3. Participation in cultural and sports activities

- Our teachers took part in Science Fest activities, and National Science day engaging students in fun, innovative activities.
- Cleanliness is next to Godliness was taught in Eco Club activities and during cleaning drive in Gandhi-Jayanti celebrations.



• Our schools won a lot of prizes in various sports meets organized at district level.





Impact of our activities:

There has been an increase in student strength at all of our partner schools. This is a direct impact of additional teachers, better infrastructure, better exposure for our students.
